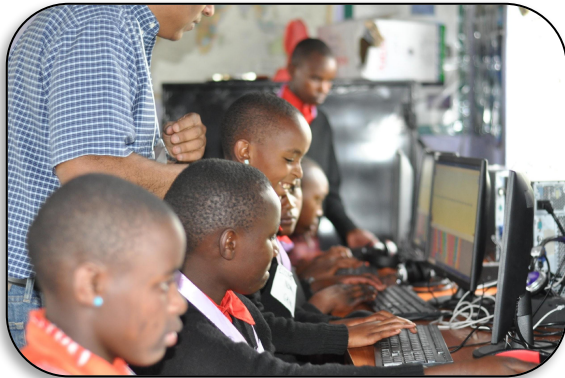


Our Purpose: Providing refuge, restoration and redirection for marginalized girls of Kenya.

Our Mission: Upholding a loving Christian environment, providing quality education, developing self-sustainability and positively impacting our community

Refuge from a life of extreme poverty, abuse or danger, to loving, holistic care. Most girls are referred to LOH by the County Child Services as identified with a serious need.

19 girls rescued to safety and hope in 2019



Restoration-Education, Counseling, Club Activities, Personal Development

Light of Hope is serving 127 girls in 2019. These are boarders (64), day scholars (49) and High Schoolers (14)

Redirection- Hope for a fulfilled life and future.

14 girls are in upper level education

9 launched back to community as responsible, educated,, contributing members of their communities

Physical and Emotional healing

Our new Medical clinic and Professional nurse will oversee girls' health and health education and reach out to our local community in service and care

Girls receive counseling, contact with home village and distant family is encouraged. Fun!! Clubs- Girl scouts, Creative Hands-sewing, knitting, crafts, Performance/Dance club- going to regional

Vocational school -for our girls and potential of offering to public-Tailoring, Welding Computer skills

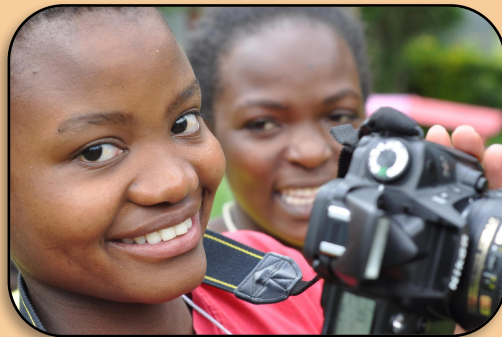
Medical Clinic charging small, locally acceptable fee to provide accessible care

2019- How you have impacted our work!!

Rescued 15 girls from poverty to hope for a bright future

Admitted 49 Day scholars to pre-primary grades giving an opportunity for adequate nutrition and education. (29 new this year)

Clinic: We offered a Community 2 day hypertension and diabetes screening with US and Kenyan care providers. We screened 110 patients, detecting some serious health concerns and referred to local care

A full time professional nurse is now at Light of Hope “Shot Peak” Medical Clinic

9 High school graduates- applying for funds to pursue higher education

14 girls in college or university

8th grade graduates- in High schools determined by national exam scores

Farm- 7 cows, 76 chickens, about 1825 eggs produced and 7300 liters of milk
Produce-bushels of potatoes, kale, onions, bananas from the school garden

Computer lab-13 computers in computer lab with Internet now available to advance learning

11 devoted teachers

29 Grounds keepers, security, cooks,
administrator, social worker, dorm mothers

Light Of Hope was founded by Boni and Sandy Karanja, each with a heart committed to following God's call to serve girls experiencing abuse, abandonment or extreme poverty in Kenya. They opened LoH in 2005 with 8 girls, 2 buildings and 2 Staff.

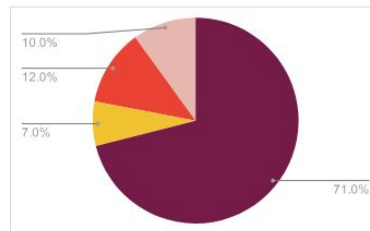

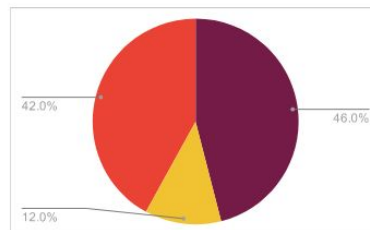
