

Our Purpose: Providing refuge, restoration and redirection for marginalized girls of Kenya

Our Mission: Upholding a loving Christian environment, providing quality education, developing self-sustainability and positively impacting our community

Refuge - from a life of extreme poverty, abuse or danger, to loving, holistic care. Most girls are referred to LOH by the county child services as identified with a serious need

12 girls rescued to safety and hope in 2024



Restoration - Education, Counseling, Club Activities, Personal Development

Light of Hope served 198 girls in 2024
These are boarders (78), day scholars (73), high schoolers (30) and college/university (17)



Redirection - Hope for a fulfilled life and future

17 girls are enrolled in post-high school education

4 launched back to community as responsible, educated, contributing members of their communities

Every girl we take in fights the cycle of extreme poverty or Social safety failures - devastated by HIV/AIDS, poverty, alcoholism, lack of family social structures



Quality education - Each girl who reaches advanced education inspires those around her.

Our students show good academic performance in national exams

Physical and Emotional healing -

Our medical clinic and professional nurse oversees the girls' health and health education and reach out to our local community in service and care



Social and emotional stability -

Girls receive counseling, contact with home village and distant family is encouraged. Fun!! Clubs: girl scouts, creative hands, sewing, knitting, crafts, performance/dance club- going to regional dance competition.

How you have impacted Light of Hope!!

Rescued: 12 girls from poverty to hope for a bright future

Admitted: 93 Day scholars to pre-primary grades giving an opportunity for adequate nutrition and education

Clinic: We screened 602 people, detecting some serious health concerns and referred to local care. A full-time professional nurse is employed at Light of Hope 'Shot Peak' Medical Clinic

High school graduates: 4

College or university: 17

9th grade graduates: 18 - determined by national exam scores

Staff: 18 - House Mothers, social workers, nurse, manager, grounds keepers, security, cooks

Devoted teachers: 13

Farm: 11 cows, 48 chickens, 9 ducks, 36 sheep about 2,280 eggs laid and 6,380 liters of milk. Produce - tomatoes, onion, sukuma, spinach, gongots, potatoes, beets, carrot, dhania, green pepper, blacknight nightshades, maize and beans for learning and use in the school garden.



Computer lab: 82 computers/tablets with internet available to advance learning. Plus 1 plane simulator

Passionate USA supporters have helped Light of Hope grow to serve over 198 girls on a campus with several dormitories, classrooms, a dining hall, large gardens, animal pastures, a library and an office. The 2019 addition of a medical clinic has improved the health outcomes for the Light of Hope girls and our community



Our History:

Light of Hope was founded by Boni and Sandy Karanja, each with a heart committed to following God's call to serve girls experiencing abuse, abandonment or extreme poverty in Kenya. They opened LOH in 2005 with 6 girls, 2 buildings and 2 staff

Our plans and dreams

Sustainability goals - initiatives to work toward self-sustainability within the Kenyan economy

Produce - small business selling

Vocational school - for our girls and potential of offering to public-tailoring, welding computer skills

Medical clinic charging small, locally acceptable fee to provide accessible care

Farm - cows (which the girl's milk) eggs, goats and sheep

Organic garden with kale, bananas, onions, tomatoes




